Greetings & Welcome to Our 37th Annual Hall of Fame Inductions

On behalf of our Board of Directors, I would like to welcome you to our 37th Annual Hall of Fame Inductions. We are again extremely honored to acknowledge this year's inductees and allow them to share with you their journey and contributions to this level of the sport. We are even more excited about the opportunity to again have as our venue this year, the Pro Football Hall of Fame. We encourage you to take in all the museum's history and enjoy the experiences that it offers.

The enshrinement of this year's class of 19 new hall of famers will see the association's 37-year total number of inductees expand from 742 members to 761 members. I want to once again acknowledge our Board of Directors for their guidance and teamwork during our project planning over the past few months. It's only through their teamwork and cooperation that we can execute this annual project. - During his twenty-seven years as a Chicago Public School coach, he
 has coached both elementary and high school football. He has earned
 six city championships on the elementary school level and is currently
 the Head Coach of his former high school, Rezin Orr Academy.
- Talented, dedicated and phenomenal football player and he has emerged as a respectable and remarkable, father, football coach and mentor to many young men in the community.

- Tom Fischer started as a player for The Snohomish County Blue Knights, The Everett Tramps, then The Snohomish County Vikings back in 1991 before taking over the team from his father Wes Fischer in 2013.
- In Tom's very first year as head coach/owner the team made it to the playoffs, and barely lost to the Pierce County Bengals, the team that won the championship in 2014.
- Tom Fischer joins his father Wes Fischer who was inducted in 2004 along with being inducted into the Pacific Northwest Football League in 2012.

Created All-League ballots and distributed them to all teams. Tabulated the ballots so owners could use player input when choosing the all-league team.
- 1998-2008 NWFL Information Officer, Treasurer (3-4 years), webmaster, video, statistician
 - Attended games to take video, stats and photos; kept the website up-to-date: schedules scores, box scores, game summaries, photos, video clips, statistics, updated and listed the leaders of every individual and team statistical category
 - 1998 the NWFL website was recognized as the best "newsletter" in the nation by Minor League Football News. The development and growth of the website never stopped.
 - Developed a system using every conceivable defensive statistical category to fairly compare defenders at every position to accurately determine the yearly Defensive MVP
 - Researched the history of minor league football in the Northwest via newspaper articles and dozens
 of interviews and created the NWFL archives.
 - Created the first draft of the yearly league schedule which was usually approved
 - Acted as an intermediary between NWFL teams and national teams to facilitate inter-league play such as the AFA, NFA and NAFL playoffs.


Carl Majer – Player Category

- Successful high school coach at Northwest Area High School




Rudy Vido – Player Category



- Between 1967 and 1970, Rudy Vido was a star in three Albany High School sports.
- Vido, a 6-foot-2, 255-pound defensive end was capable of running a 4.7 second 40-yard dash. He enrolled at the University of Albany despite interest from over 100 colleges, including Notre Dame, Pittsburgh and Maryland.
- In 1973, he was named the program's outstanding defensive lineman with 105 tackles, seven sacks, and
 one blocked punt. Vido, an All-Metroland choice, also played on the school's only undefeated football
 team in 1974. He totaled 80 tackles, six sacks and three fumble recoveries.
- Vido became the first UAlbany player to ink a professional contract, when he signed as a free agent with
 the New England Patriots. He went on to play for the Canadian Football League's Toronto Argonauts
 and was a four-time Empire Football League defensive MVP as a semi-professional for the Albany
 Metro Mallers.
- Vido played 8 years of semi-pro ball. He played 7 years for Albany Metro Mallers, where he earned All-League Honors and four defensive MVP awards. Also played 1 season for the Troy Uncle Sam football club. He was named to the 1977 Sporting News Minor League All-American first team, where he was credited 125 tackles and 10 sacks during the '77 season.
- Rudy passed away on April 18, 2017. He lived in Colonie, NY with his wife and children and was the behavioral program director for the Millview Traumatic Brain Injury Program. He also coached his son and daughter in Colonie Pop Warner football and cheerleading.

- Played for the Virginia Vipers in 2002 2004. He went on to start his own adult team in 2006, the VA Crusaders.
- Joined the Mason Dixon Football League Organization in 2006, the official birth of the VA Crusaders.
- Under his leadership and direction, Coach Stith celebrates over 140
 wins and only 24 losses to date during his 11-year career as VA
 Crusaders Head Coach.
- In addition, Coach Stith coaches AFE USA Team All Stars and is a member of their Advisory Board.




